## PROGRAMME

### THE ROLL OF HONOUR

Maids Moreton does not have a War Memorial but in the church there is a list of twelve of the Maids Moreton soldiers who gave their lives in WWI.

### THE ROLL OF HONOUR TRAIL

This is a short walk round the village showing where these soldiers once lived.

### THE PLAQUES

Outside each location, the plaque gives brief details of the life of the soldier and his involvement in the village.

### CHILDREN'S QUIZ

Search the plaques for your answer.

### GRAVEYARD TRAIL

Many soldiers who survived are buried in the church yard. There is also one War Grave and other graves of historical interest.

### PAM SMITH'S RESEARCH (on display in the church)

Pam's research details the men's units, some personal information, places of battle, maps and fascinating facts.

### PHOTO ON CHURCH WALL

This is a puzzle. It shows ten soldiers one of whom survived. Why were they framed together? What is the connection?
