We have enjoyed some very interesting exhibitions during the Spring and Summer months: *Van Gogh* at Tate Britain, *The Renaissance Nude* at the Royal Academy and *Treasures of the Museum* at Birmingham Museum and Art Gallery, together with accompanying lectures and film slides.



#### **Theatre News**

In the last few months we have been very lucky to have seen a variety of shows including opera, ballet, 2 musicals, and an Agatha Christie play.

Magic Flute – Welsh National Opera. A small group of us braved Milton Keynes on a Saturday, and had an afternoon of wonderful music, singing and drama. A very simple set, so easy to transport, and striking costumes. A successful venture.

**Remains of the Day** – We saw this in Oxford. It was very cleverly presented with the pre war scenes, and those of the 1950's, with many actors playing other characters, by the change of a hat or a coat for example. The butler, who has given unstinting loyalty for numerous years to Darlington Hall, was played by Stephen Boxer and the former housekeeper by Niamh Cusack.

**Victoria** – (Northern Ballet)This is how this one was reported to me. "The choreography and the talent of the dancers in interpreting the depth of emotion really stood out in this production. A word of warning though – it is really worth seeking out a fairly detailed synopsis beforehand – or buying a programme and reading it! I think quite a few of us were struggling to follow all but the most obvious storylines, and in retrospect realise that we missed quite a few nuances! "

**Les Miserables** – I think we all knew the songs, and the story had been clarified, for some, by the recent BBC series. There was wonderful singing, clever staging- with some aspects not seen at the London production. The scene with the killings at the Barricade was especially poignant with a streak of light focusing on one actor at a time as they fell. A standing ovation was given to the cast, who all looked as they had thoroughly enjoyed the show too.

I have had one e mail saying that 'it was amazing and by far my favourite'.

**Hair** – I think that this was a wonderful chance for people to be transported back to the 60's. A real trip down memory lane.

**The Mousetrap**- I was told it was very enjoyable, humorous too and played to a packed house.

Although the museum is small it is very well laid out and interesting - the Lenborough Hoard display is worth the visit by itself. The ladies seemed to enjoy the jewellery cabinets and the village life display was really fascinating. Thornborough's medieval bridge also featured.

We also visited the church, which is a stone's throw away. Again very interesting. We were also just able to enjoy the last part of the lunch time concert. If you are in Aylesbury, both are worth a visit and both are free. We can recommend the teas!

Other recent activities - all of local history interest - have included visits to Tingewick, Westbury and a talk on a personal childhood, throughout the seasons, in Padbury.

A different idea was for group members to share their own family histories, many showing items of local interest.

Our meetings are held on the first and third Thursdays of each month. On the first Thursday we visit places of interest and on the third Thursday we meet in Maids Morton Village Hall.

We have now finalised our programme for September to December with a visit to Turweston on 5<sup>th</sup> September, a talk by a "man of the road" on 19<sup>th</sup> September entitled "A Tramp Comes to Town". This promises to be one not to miss. On 3rd October we have a visit to Deanshanger for a talk by a member of the Deanshanger Village Heritage Society and on the 17th we will be in our meeting hall for a talk entitled "Hartridges - A Light Hearted History with Anecdotes". In November we have a talk by two well known locals, "London to Kathmandu by Double Decker Bus" and on the third Thursday the talk will be "Milton Keynes - Last of the New Towns".
