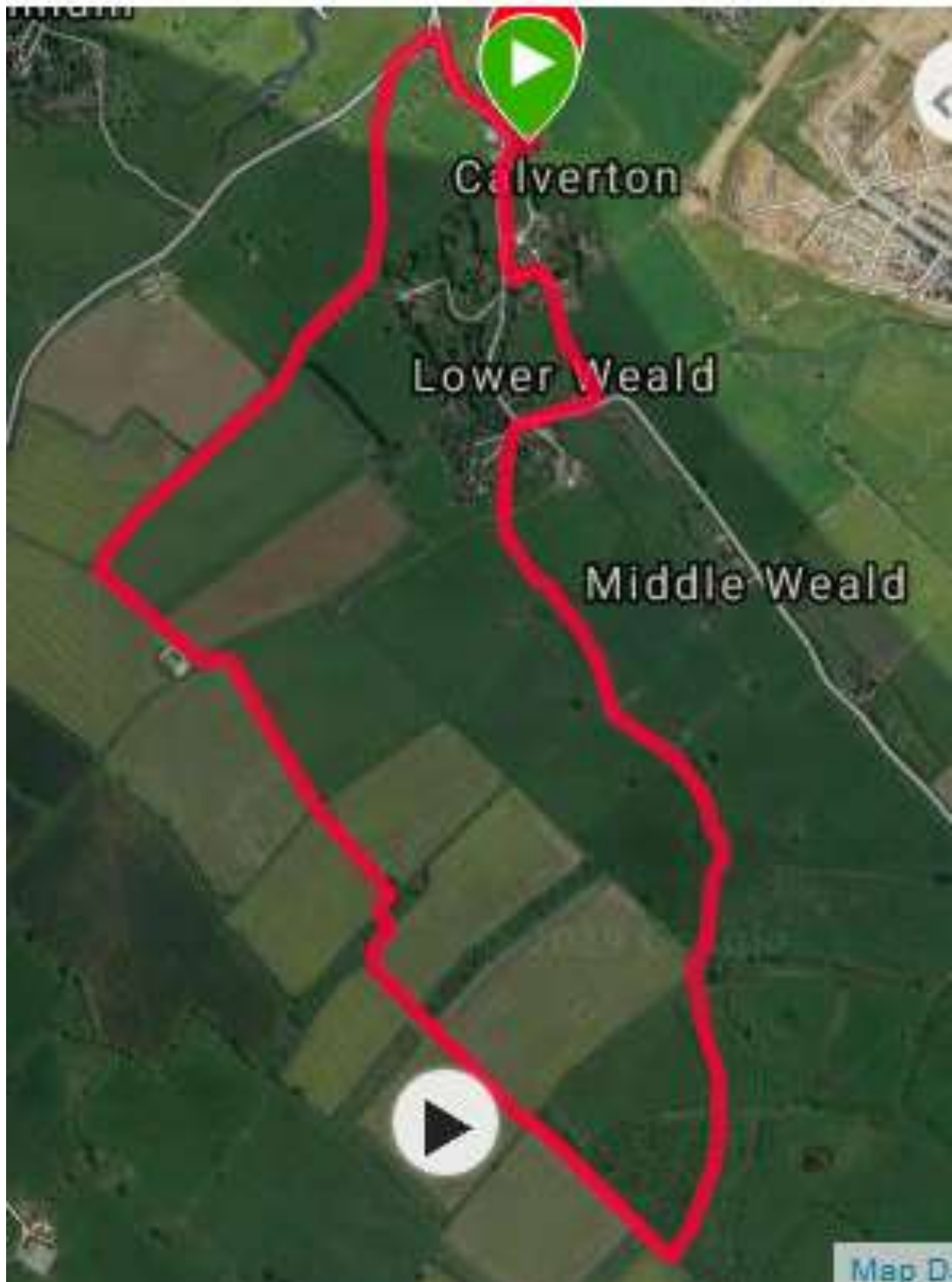


**2019-06 Calverton.**

Distance 3.9 miles, 2hrs 10. 11 stiles, hay meadow with long grass. Sun, long views, lots of history. Source: Bucks CC leaflet from 2014.



The walk this week starts from “The Shoulder of Mutton” pub in Lower Weald in the parish of Calverton.

**Directions:**

Take the A422 towards Deanshanger. At the Deanshanger roundabout turn right (3<sup>rd</sup> exit) signed Passenham, and then immediately turn left, else you end in the quarry!

Go through the hamlet of Passenham and at a T-junction, turn left.

After a few hundred yards, as the road bends left, turn right, signed Calverton.

The Shoulder of Mutton is on the left. Drive through to the right of the main building into a larger car park.

Walk information

1. All the stiles are in good condition, and not overgrown as they were when we did the walk in 2014. There are 11 of them, all straight-forward.
2. There is an adventurous bridge across a narrow stream.
3. One field to be crossed has long grass, which was quite hard work. It was completely dry on the recce, but if it has been wet the day before or overnight, gaiters and/or waterproof trousers would be advisable.
4. There are cows, but they are all well-behaved and non-curious.
5. The walk is almost level – a slight short rise in the first field, and a gently rising field at the end.
6. The walk is 4 miles long.
